2023 Joint Conference of the Northern Nut Growers Association, the Chestnut Growers of America, and the Walnut Council Highlights


The 2023 Joint Conference of the Northern Nut Growers Association (NNGA), the Chestnut Growers of America (CGA), and the Walnut Council (WC) will take place July 23-26, 2023 on the University of Missouri campus in Columbia, Missouri. Complete details can be found in the Spring 2023 The Nutshell or the NNGA website (nutgrowing.org). Register on-line with credit card at centerforagroforestry.org/event/2023-nut-growerconference. Full registration includes program packet, favor, Sunday welcome reception, poster and Show and Tell sessions; Monday all-day field tours and evening live auction, Tuesday concurrent technical sessions and box lunch, Tuesday evening social and banquet, and the Wednesday technical session. Alternatively register for the CAPS (companion and children) program which includes Sunday welcome reception, Monday live auction, Tuesday tour at Warm Springs Ranch, lunch at the A-Frame Winegarden on the Blufftop, with optional afternoon wine tasting, and social and banquet. Register by June 24 to take advantage of early bird discount. Registration does not include transportation or lodging. Plan to use your own vehicle or arrange for carpooling at the conference for offcampus activities and for Monday's field trip to HARF.

Reservations and payments for on-campus housing should have been made already. A block of rooms with discounted rates is available thru June 23 at The Hampton Inn and Suites Columbia at the University of Missouri, 1225 Fellows Place (not the one at 3410 Clark Lane) about a half mile from conference venue is the main hotel but the discounted group rate has expired. To make reservations call 573-214-2222 to book at the special "Walnut Council" group rate regardless of which organization you belong to at \$115 + tax per night or book online at <u>bit.ly/3jlBuXc</u>. Rooms include a free hot breakfast and free parking. Pets are allowed with an additional one-time charge of \$50 for up to 4 days. There will be an opportunity to participate as a donor or bidder in a live or silent auction or both.
